Parking Survey Summary

An ad-hoc committee of the deacons on parking at Auburn First Baptist Church received 89 responses to an online survey regarding parking at the church. The results of the survey revealed that a significant number of our members have difficulty finding a parking spot on Sunday, especially for the 11:00 a.m. worship hour. The majority of respondents also reported that they would be willing to walk from the city's parking deck, which we encourage for those who are able to walk the short distance from the deck to our buildings. Several respondents noted that the recent addition of parking signs at the entrances of our lots seems to be effectively discouraging persons who are not parking for church. The ad-hoc committee will continue to study the parking situation and looks forward to bringing recommendations to the deacons in the future.


